Program Vision & Overview

The **Grammy Award winning Music Program** at Mira Costa High School is rooted in a tradition of, and a commitment to **comprehensive music education through performance**.

With the intent of providing **each student performer** with experiences that will result in their finding wonder and excitement in the creative endeavor, all of the ensembles at Mira Costa **are focused on the development of creative and collaborative performance**.

In the pursuit of student creativity, the **highest quality literature is selected** to encourage the greatest individual musical growth, depth of experience and **development of a life-long appreciation for music and the arts**.

Wind and Percussion Ensembles

Concert Band • Symphonic Band • Wind Ensemble

The bands at Mira Costa High School provide **opportunities for musicians at many stages of musical development**. From the educational level repertoire of the Concert Band, to the professional-level repertoire of the Wind Ensemble, the **students pursue a high degree of musical integrity** when approaching any piece of music.

In the process of recreating art through performance, ensemble members learn about the composers and their compositional purpose, seeking the original intent of the music. The focus across all the bands is the student's individual musical growth and the growth of the individual's appreciation of music. Every member is a vital component of the ensemble and is important to both the process as well as the product.

Marching Ensembles

Marching Band & Colorguard • Winterguard

The marching ensembles at Mira Costa **take the musicianship acquired in the concert ensembles out onto the field and the court, offering PE credit to their members**. For students new to the school, participation in the Marching Band offers a head start in musical and social growth, learning their way around campus, meeting some great students (other freshmen and upper classmen), getting a great tan (remember the hat and sunscreen) and having a great time.

Besides performing at home football games and basketball games, the Marching Ensembles also go to competitions at local high schools and perform at various other local events. **In order to participate in a Marching Ensemble, students must be concurrently enrolled in one of the concert ensembles or Colorguard**.

Jazz Ensembles

Jazz Band

Students at Mira Costa also have the opportunity to perform music in the distinctly American idiom of Jazz. The Jazz Band meets during the day, and performances occur at school events, festivals, concerts and other community events. Jazz Combos are also formed out of students in the Jazz Band for gigs, concerts, and other performances.

Chamber Ensembles

Percussion Studio

The Percussion Studio picks up after Marching Band is over in the fall. Whole group sessions work on techniques from the big three percussion instruments: Snare, Marimba, Timpani. Other topics on Cymbals and Accessories are also included. Each session adds new elements and topics for each instrument such as: new rudiments, rolls, mallet/stick choice, four mallet technique, timpani grip and stroke, single stroke rolls, sticking choices, etc.

Smaller groups break off after whole group to work on percussion ensemble works of varying difficulty and style: Classic, Contemporary, Theatrical, Marching Percussion, etc. with the objective of putting together a staged concert that covers a broad range of percussion music. The annual Percussion Studio Concert runs the gambit of performance styles from those seen in Stomp! And Blast! to the contemporary percussion ensemble pieces played on the stages of university music departments.

A Note on the UC/CSU Arts Requirement

All students hoping to attend either the **CSU or UC system** of colleges (as well as many private colleges) must meet what is known as the **"F" requirement by completing one year of Visual or Performing Arts credit**. All of the wind and percussion concert ensembles as well as the jazz band at Mira Costa meet this requirement.

What the School District Provides

With school district budgets cut down to the bone, Mira Costa High School only provides for a Director (salary and benefits), the band hall for practice, a very modest budget for new music purchase and instruction, and an auditorium for performances. In the past, the MB Education Foundation, MB Athletic Foundation and Mira Costa PTSA have also been able to provide support for some special one time request items.

What the Mira Costa Band Boosters Provide

First, the parents (band boosters) and donors in the community provide the funds for everything else. Secondly, the band booster parents also provide a pool of volunteers for our many activities.

- ❖ New instruments for the needs of a growing program (\$)
- ❖ Repairs and maintenance on current instruments (\$)
- ❖ Additional music purchases needed by a large program (\$)
- ❖ Section coaches to supplement instruction in a smaller class size setting (\$)
- ❖ Equipment and supplies from stands and chairs to field paint and paper (\$)
- ❖ Uniforms for the band and colorguard plus maintenance and cleaning (\$)
- ❖ Festival and competition entry fees and music copyright fees (\$)
- ❖ Transportation for competitions, gigs, etc. (\$)
- ❖ Chaperone supervision for festival, competition, and other trips (volunteers)
- ❖ Organization of uniforms prior to and after use (volunteers)
- ❖ Blocking off traffic along Peck Avenue for marching to home games (volunteers)
- ❖ Blocking off bleachers for the band use at home and away games (volunteers)
- ❖ Organizing public performances and parades (volunteers)
- ❖ Organizing specials awards and banquets, etc. (volunteers)

This is far from an exhaustive list. We are the organization that provides the assistance and the funds for an enriched experienced. We make the marching season, performances, and competitions outside the classroom possible. We help reach for the stars!

How the Band Boosters Operate

The Band Boosters is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that meets monthly during the school year, usually the first Tuesday of the month in the Mira Costa Band Hall at 7:00 PM. By having a student in the program, you are automatically a member. All parents and supporters are welcome to attend to provide input into our activities.

Occasionally, officers meet more frequently, either in person or by email to conduct the business of our organization. At the Tuesday evening meetings, officers and/or others in charge of events or tasks meet to discuss needs and aims. The director of the program, Joel Carlson, attends these meetings, and provides vision and overview for the program and its ongoing development.

We have an up-to-date website from which information and forms can be easily obtained.

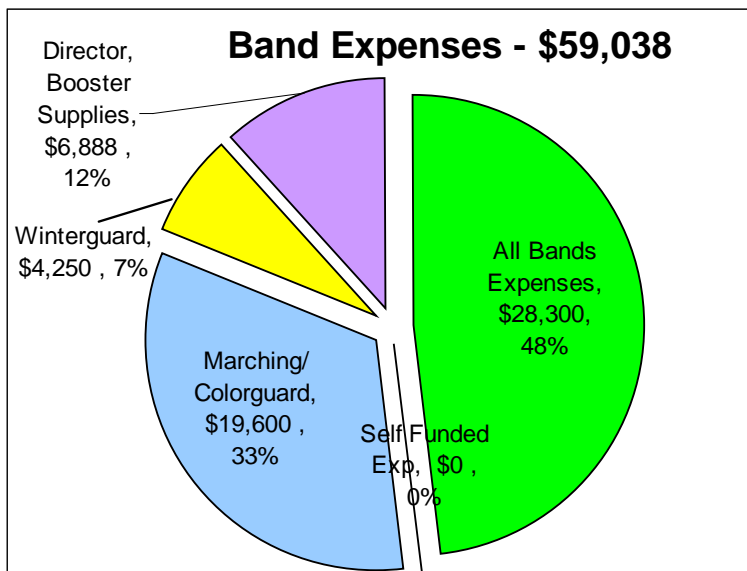
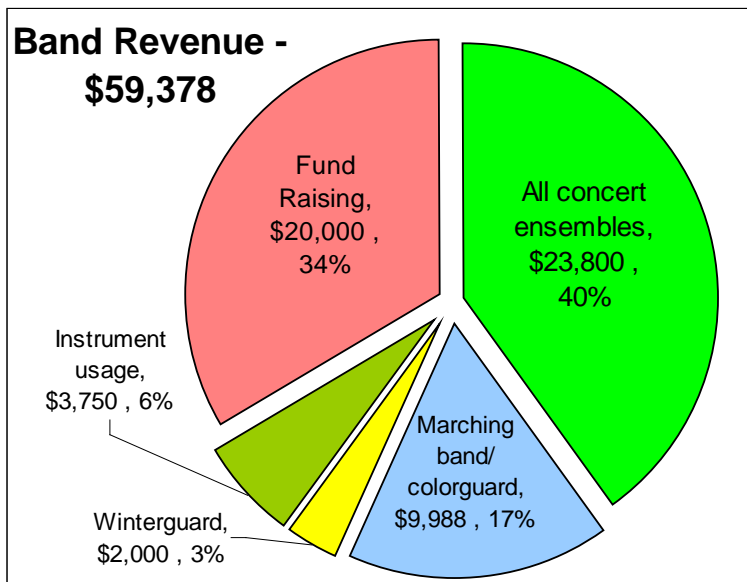

Parents can easily sign up for email messages, committees and change their contact information. Minutes from the meetings are on line but you have to be a booster member to access them. You are automatically granted membership to the parents section, but must sign up.

'Fair Share' Monetary Contribution 2009-2010

***BUS TRANSPORTATION NOTE FOR ALL PROGRAMS:** There will be a transportation fee charges for all trips beyond the marching competitions (which is covered in the \$100 fee above). The cost of additional trips will be based upon the actual cost for each trip divided by the number of participants. Students will have to provide a check for the bus transportation with their permission slip.

MARCHING BAND and COLORGUARD NOTE FOR PARENTS: The \$150 Fair Share fee includes all summer camp fees and the uniform reserve fee \$50/year. With the exception of personal items purchased and owned by students, there will be no additional uniform or camp fees this year.

****INSTRUMENT USAGE FEE:** This fee is for students that are using the school owned instruments for the music programs. This fee covers the annual cost of upkeep and repairs on each instrument.

***** WINTERGUARD:** For the winter/spring season of guard, there will be a separate contribution for those that participate in this activity. The details of this will be provided to all interested students/families in October.

From the 4 concerts over the course of this year, to the 5 home games and 4 competitions with the marching band in the fall, the band’s performance at the Hometown Fair and the fundraising opportunities there, not to mention all of the competitions, parades and festivals in the winter and spring, there are many different opportunities for you to both see your student excel and support their needs in the program simultaneously.

We need each family to be involved in supporting the program. Please examine the list below and choose a first and second choice from one of the committees to participate in. As a committee member you will not be expected to attend every event overseen by your committee, but will called upon to help at various times throughout the year by the coordinating Committee Chair. If the first committee you select is full, we will shift you to your 2nd choice. Committees may meet occasionally as needed to coordinate their respective responsibilities.

Fundraising Committee: This year the committee will coordinate (1) direct giving (2) Hometown Fair booths (3) candy sales at football games and (4) a car wash with kids’ participation. Please note that several previous fund raising activities have been eliminated.

Marching Band Committee: This committee coordinates (1) band social events, (2) the pit crew during performances, (3) home games, (4) travel chaperones, (5) uniforms and alternate uniforms and is primarily busy during the Fall Semester, with a few parades in the spring.

Communications/Publicity Committee: These individuals coordinate (1) publications and programs, (2) media public relations, (3) membership functions, (4) photography.

Concerts and Auxiliary Committee: This committee coordinates all functions related to concerts, festivals, and the year end banquet as well as representing the Colorguard/Winterguard and Percussion Studio.

There will be several opportunities for you to sign up for your favorite activity within a committee, so please just indicate a general interest in one of the areas above. Your interest will be entered on the band website (intranet for booster members only) so that you may receive emails targeted to those specific committee members.

Using the Website

The website for the band can be found at www.miracostabands.com. This website is used to provide information to all members of the Band Boosters. A member can be any parent or guardian of a Mira Costa band student. Parents or guardians need to click on the "Parents" tab on the website where you will be prompted to "Sign In".

Parents can put in up to two emails addresses each, assuring that you receive up to the minute information at work and at home. You may change the email addresses at any time. When you sign up for a committee or subcommittee, the leader of that committee will be able to send emails to that select group of people. Minutes of the band booster meetings are available for members. Members may also resign at any time, which senior parents frequently do in June. The same seniors can sign up for the alumni announcements which are occasional.

Frequently, emails of interest will be sent out to all band families. In addition, the calendar is updated frequently by the person in charge of a particular event. Officers of the band boosters have access to sending out information or altering calendar events as necessary. If you need a message sent out, please contact the appropriate officer for help. If you are a leader of a subcommittee, you can reach all your committee members through the parent "Log In." For more information, or if you experience a problem, contact Jim Van Zanten or Penny Ford.

MCHS Marching Band Uniform Information

Students in Marching Band have two uniforms, the formal full uniform and the alternate uniform. Students must own their own alternate uniform and the specified garments worn under the full uniform. Some garments must be purchased at cost through the Band Boosters using the following Order Form.

Season Shirt – owned by student

The t-shirt based on the field show that everyone orders for wear with alternate uniform, changes each year.

Alternate Uniform– owned by student

The alternate uniform is worn for away games, pep rallies, and most small band performances. Except for the season shirt, it is usually worn for several years.

- Member Jacket
- Black Dickies Work pants*
- Season Shirt
- Black athletic shoes*

The Member Jacket is part of the alternate uniform and must be purchased through Band Boosters. Athletic shoes should be black; a very small amount of color is acceptable. Inexpensive black canvas sneakers are acceptable.

Full Uniform – owned by school

This is the formal full band uniform worn at home games, competitions and parades, and is owned by the school. Students dress at school at call-time. During uniform fittings we will fit your child for the following:

- Uniform pants (“bibbers”)
- Uniform jacket
- Hat/plume

Underneath Full Uniform Wear– owned by student

In order to protect the band uniforms and to allow for students to dress in full uniform easily at school, every student must wear the following personal clothing:

- Solid black t-shirt*
- Black or dark colored athletic shorts*
- Black socks*
- Black marching shoes
- Black gloves (Wind Instrumentalists)

On occasions calling for the full uniform, students will not be given their uniforms unless they are wearing a solid black t-shirt and black or dark colored athletic shorts. No exceptions.
